They are tasked with caring for these chicks from the starting point of the eggs, watching them crack and struggle to come out of the egg, and eventually get to hold and care for them as they become fuzzy sweet chicks before returning to the farm. Every class in the school visits (in the hall this year) several times over the course of the 10 days. It is a joyous time for all!
